### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

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## 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

<b>Flammability</b>	Non flammable. May evolve toxic gases (hydrocarbons, carbon oxides) when heated to decomposition.
<b>Fire and Explosion</b>	Non flammable. If product is present in a fire, toxic gases (carbon oxides, hydrocarbons) may be evolved. Evacuate area and contact emergency services. Remain upwind and notify those downwind of hazard. Wear full protective equipment including Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) when combating fire. Use waterfog to cool intact containers and nearby storage areas.

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

<b>Spillage</b>	If spilt (bulk), absorb with sand or similar. Wear splash-proof goggles, PVC/rubber gloves, coveralls and boots. Where an inhalation risk exists, wear a Type A (Organic vapour) respirator. Collect and place in sealable containers for disposal. Caution, spill site may be slippery.
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## 7. STORAGE AND HANDLING

<b>Storage</b>	Store in cool, dry, well ventilated area, removed from oxidising agents, acids and foodstuffs. Ensure containers are adequately labelled, protected from physical damage and sealed when not in use.
<b>Handling</b>	Before use carefully read the product label. Use of safe work practices are recommended to avoid eye or skin contact and inhalation. Observe good personal hygiene, including washing hands before eating. Prohibit eating, drinking and smoking in contaminated areas.
